In addition to traditional foster care, EA provides Intensive Services Foster Care (ISFC), Short Term Residential Therapeutic Programs (STRTP) and Transitional Housing Programs (THP).

THP Transitional Housing Programs

THP+FC PROGRAM

Eligibility

Our Transitional Housing Program + Foster Care is a placement option for any young adult, 18-21 years old, who is AB12 eligible and maintains one of the following criteria throughout the program:

- Enrollment in high school or equivalent program (GED)
- Part-time enrollment in college or a vocational school
- Scheduled work of 80 hours per month
- Participation in an employment program

or

 Inability to complete the above due to a medical or mental health condition

Housing Options

Once approved, EA will help clients identify and apply for housing, and assist with moving.

Host Home

This is a great option for clients needing more support and oversight, or clients wanting to live with a former foster family or a family friend. Clients reside in a family home, receive life skills training, mentoring and help achieving goals.

Remote Site

Clients will live independently; alone or with approved roommates. EA is included on leasing contracts.

Program

Counties should contact an Intake Coordinator at *placements@ea.org* to refer young adults. Once program approval is granted and housing secured, clients begin receiving a bi-monthly stipend.



EA will advance the housing deposit, provide a move-in kit and temporarily pay rent on behalf of clients, as needed. Move-in kits have necessary household items to get clients started. After six months in program, only 50 percent of the kit cost has to be repaid. EA deducts a small amount from each check to repay all upfront costs. The goal is to support our clients in becoming more independent by eventually paying rent on their own.
